
Two Digit Numbers Adding Activity



A fun activity for students to practise adding two digit numbers from the combined score of two dice, without using a calculator.

Suitable for students aged 5+

Learning Outcome: Students will be able to transcribe two digit numbers from two dice into numerals.

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Two Digit Numbers Adding Activity

Theme: Adding Age range: 5+

Context

A fun activity for students to practise adding two digit numbers from the combined score of two dice, without using a calculator. To vary the activity it can be played using different number systems.

Preparation:

Print out the A₄ sheets. Cut out the panels so that you have four A₅ game cards in ₄ different colours. Print out four copies of the die template. Cut out the templates and fold into four dice. Putting cotton wool balls inside the dice will make them roll better. You may wish to let the children make up their own dice.

HOW TO PLAY:

You will need four players working in pairs.

Each pair will need two dice, a pencil and two A5 game cards.

The first player throws the two dice and tells the second player what to write in the first two boxes. The players repeat this until the first two boxes on each row are filled.

The players then add up the numbers and write the results onto the card.

Then the players swap roles. You could make this a race between the two pairs.

Learning Outcomes:


Students will be able to transcribe two digit numbers from dice into numerals. They will also gain practice in adding two digit numbers together.


